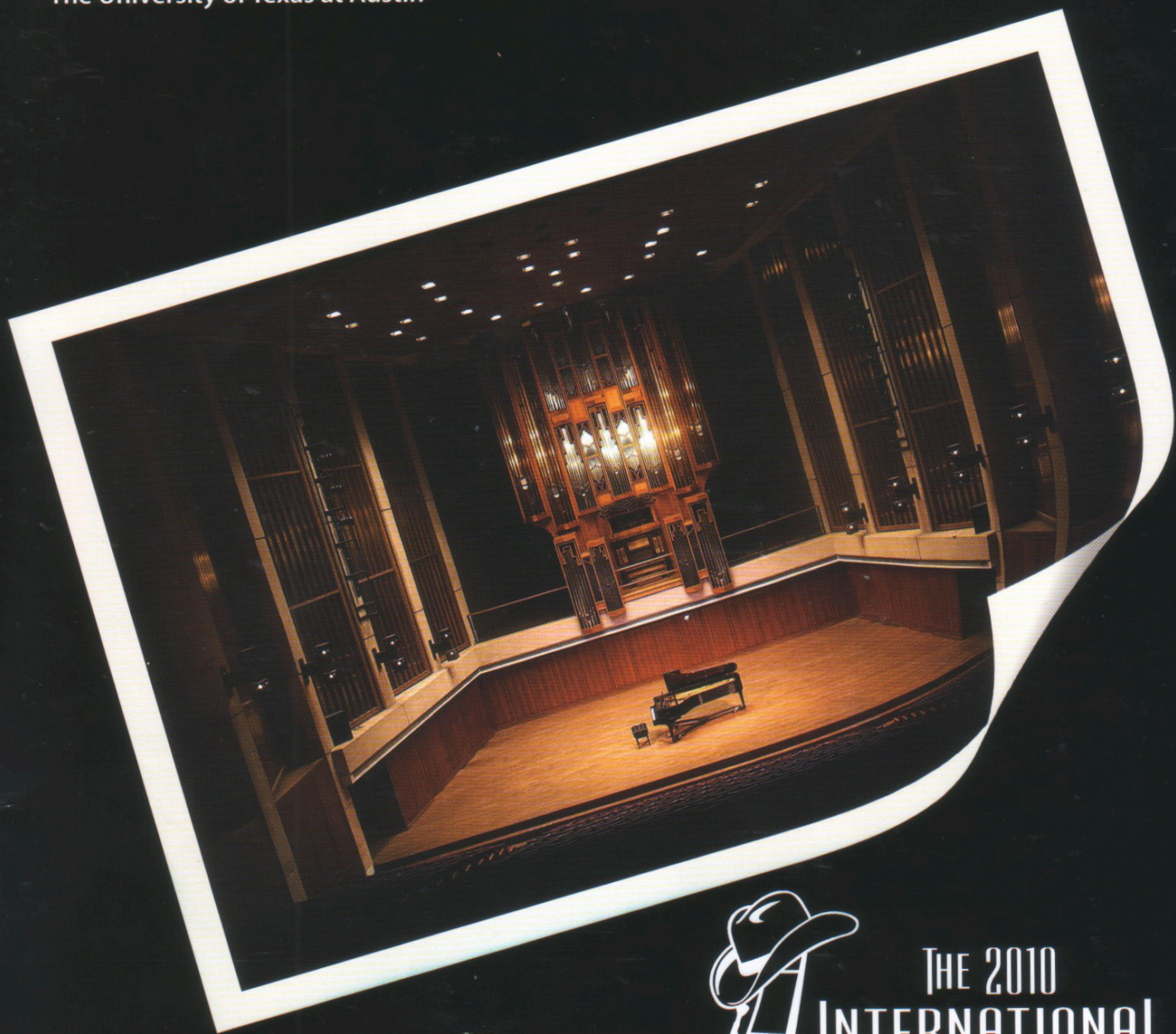

Before my current positions with the Austin Symphony (1978), Austin Lyric Opera (1987) and the Victoria Bach Festival (1984), I was a member of the Mobile Symphony (1968-70), Pensacola Symphony (1969-71), American Wind Symphony (1973), and the Calgary Philharmonic (1973-75). Along with my duties as a bass trombonist, since 1971 I have been heard at rare moments playing bass sackbut.

I studied with Peter Reichlin at the University of South Alabama and Terry Cravens at the University of Texas. However, I had quite a knack for dropping out my senior year, did it twice.

In tandem with my performing, from 1970-88 I was a piano technician, but that career was replaced by technology when I earned an associate's degree in electronics. That led to my current full time position as a customer support analyst for Travis County, where

I troubleshoot computer problems and pull my hair out.

Then there's my very part time freelance photography business that I've been trying to get off the ground for several years and my placing as a nationally mid-ranked age group triathlete.

#### **Steven Bryant**

Steven Bryant, Associate Professor of Tuba/Euphonium at the University of Texas at Austin, also serves as Principal Tubist with the Austin Symphony Orchestra and the Austin Lyric Opera Orchestra. He was a founding member of the University's Faculty Brass Quintet, the UT Brass, and the Texas Tuba Quartet. He served as Director of Undergraduate Studies for the School of Music and as Treasurer for the International Tuba/Euphonium Association (formerly TUBA) for six years. Mr. Bryant is the Associate Director for Administrative Affairs for the Butler School of Music.

Professor Bryant received a

Bachelor of Music degree in Music Theory from The Ohio State University, a Master of Music in Tuba Performance from Wichita State University, and continued his graduate work at The University of Iowa. In 1986 he hosted an International Tuba Euphonium Conference, sponsored by UT-Austin and the Tubists Universal Brotherhood Association. He organizes and hosts the annual Merry TubaChristmas Austin celebration.
